Fidget Quilts

According to the Alzheimer's Association, an estimated 5.2 million Americans of all ages had Alzheimer's disease in 2013. This includes an estimated 5 million people age 65 and older and approximately 200,000 individuals younger than age 65 who had younger-onset Alzheimer's. Frequetly, patients with Alzheimer's and other forms of dementia get fidgety hands. Fidget quilts are a soothing thing to those patients because the quilt gives their hands something to do. Make your own fidget quilt for the person in your life with Alzheimer's or just to donate to someone in a care center with the simple steps in *Quilters Newsletter June/July* 2014.

Alzheimer's Patient Fidget Quilt

Community Service project partnered with Alzheimer's Association, Central Ohio Chapter-Columbus Ohio. Donations will be given to their Home Health Care program; supporting families responsible for care of their loved ones that are diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease.

Fidget quilts help to occupy the Alzheimer's loved one by settling or calming the need to keep fingers busy. Please keep in mind these quilts will be washed and dried with industrial / commercial machines then regularly washed and dried with home machines.

The bound finished quilt is to measure 20 inches x 20 inches.

Suggested Materials:

- · Varying fabrics of different texture
- Cord safely secured, without gaps or sewn under fabric for texture
- Ribbon: attached without gaps
- Large Rick Rack trim secured without gaps
- Large plastic zippers (Metal zippers can cut thin skin of elderly patients, Large zippers have a larger pull tab. The smaller zippers require more dexterity.)
- Velcro for scratching and ripping (strongly attached if to be pulled)
- Ruffles, fabric; tucked, smocked or shirred
- Pockets
- · Tags sewn on securely that cannot be pulled or worked free

The Alzheimer's patient is, at times, nearly like an infant that will try to put items in their mouth, nose and ears. Materials that can tangle or twine around patient's fingers effect blood flow.

Materials not to use:

- No slick fabrics on back of quilt (may not stay on lap)
- No buttons, beads, trinkets, keys, jewelry, and no ribbons or chords hanging free.
