

The tour will depart Thursday morning, April 6. After stopping in Middlebury for guilt shops and lunch, we will check into the Hampton Inn. Friday and Saturday, the bus will take us to the show. Saturday evening you have the option of the Comedy Sport Show--a clean, funny show that has nothing to do with sports! Sunday, after breakfast and checkout, we will travel to Navy Pier and/or tour the city. Depart for home at 2 p.m. Cost of \$388 includes transportation, Escort, 3 nights hotel, 3 extended continental breakfasts, 2 quilt show admissions, Chicago City Tour, Comedy Show, Tax, and Driver's tip.
