Have you ever wondered what can be created using a sewing machine that is also an embroidery machine? Judy Sagara from Quilt Beginnings will describe how to embroider, show the materials that are needed, and share samples of embroidered projects. Then Judy will show examples of how embroidery and quilting were combined into quilts and other fabric creations. Wait until you see what can be done!

Hand embroidery can also be included in quilted items. Bring bring any of your hand and/or machine embroidered creations to share at the meeting.

"Star" Quilts Due at September Meeting!



Comfort quilts for our Service Project will be collected at the September meeting. There will be a special showing of all the quilts to see how everyone incorporated a STAR into

the quilt either with a star pattern or an appliqué star — or perhaps another innovative way.

Donated quilts currently are being given to the Westerville AWARE program which is an outgrowth of Westerville Caring and Sharing and serves families in need during the entire year. Quilts are given to new babies in low income families and to any children in families in distress, such as a fire.

I am proposing that we consider other places for our quilts. I have contacted the City of Westerville about one possibility. This would involve placing quilts in Westerville Police Cruisers for use in emergencies involving young children. They would act as a "comfort" quilt as well as in times of need for warmth. This project would also be a "Westerville" project for our guild and could be publicized as such.
