Remember starting in June, Shirley Thompson will be asking you to sign up for a volunteer slot so think about what you can do to help us. We need "white glove" ladies to "guard" the quilts and show visitors the backs of quilts and answer questions from visitors. We need volunteers at the entry desk to take admissions and sell the quilt booklet. We need few quilters to do some 30 minute demos on various quilting techniques. Of course, we need lots of helpers for set up on 8/30 and take down on the evening of 8/31.

Don't forget to get entries ready! You'll want to win one of those ribbons Becky made for us. We can't have a quilt show without lots of quilts. We think we have space for everyone to enter a couple of items. Ruthie Hoover is looking over the layout chart for how many we can hang which is all dependent on the sizes of your entries. Trish will distribute entry forms in May and will need your completed entry forms not later than the July meeting.

At our last guild meeting the membership voted to allow members free admission to the show as long as they participate in the show. Participation means you (1) enter a quilt or (2) volunteer in some way. Pretty simple requirements we think. (Note that this was not a unanimous vote, so if there is more opposition from members not present, we can revisit the issue.)

Eunice writes:

I use the product called
