weeds and all the other landscape features you see every day but don't really see. How much detail can you see of the leaves on the tree you are standing under. How much on that tree 1/2 a block away or more?? When you really look at what you see vs what you know they look like, you may be surprised at how little detail you actually see. You may also alter the way you think about what a "landscape" quilt is. Bring in yours and we will discuss!

Please bring any landscape quilts you have created that might fit into this category for show and tell! Wear your fun holiday hat to the meeting! There will also be a lot of fun and surprises too!



October Raffle - $4\frac{1}{2}$ Fast Nine Patch Block

The 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fast Nine Patch block was demonstrated during the September meeting carrousels by Vicki Melvin. If you picked up 6" tan paisley squares (provided), add your <u>prewashed</u> medium or dark prints and make your raffle entries.

One entry represents a set (a positive and a negative block) created by this fast technique. Enter as many block sets as you have tan paisley squares. Please return any unused tan paisley squares.



The Rolling Library group would like to thank all of your who have so kindly donated patterns, magazines, and books. The library is full of won-


derful resources for every kind of quilt imaginable.

October Featured Quilter: Becky Dickson Trunk Show: "Quirky Quilts" (doors open at 6 pm)

Our final Featured Quilter, Becky Dickson will display her "Quirky Quilts". Beginning at 6:00 PM, join us for the trunk show and to learn more about another WestervilleQuilt Guild talented member.

Why is Becky's trunk show called "quirky"? The Urban Dictionary defines "quirky" as unique, unconventional, different in a good way, not "by the book", and more! Becky describes her quilting style as:

"...quirky is probably pretty accurate. When I started using lots of embellishments, some of my traditional friends teased me about "gorping" up my quilts. I love color especially brights. I'm moving toward more art quilting, but still like to do some traditional stuff..."

A charter member of the Westerville Quilt Guild, she loves the openness of the group and the enthusiasm of the membership. Becky has self-published several patterns including her innovative series of foil candy wrapper techniques. Her patterns for jackets and clocks created a demand for instructional classes. Becky has also taught paper piecing, jackets, and art techniques.

How did she start sewing or quilting?

"I started sewing doll clothes when I was probably 10 or so. I remember sitting beside my mother and watching her sew our school dresses (probably bugging her to death!) By the time I was in junior high I was making some of my own clothes...."

In many venues, Becky's quilts have received numerous awards. She has entered the Ohio State Fair for the past 10 years and won a number of ribbons - including several Best of Show ribbons. Her personal quilting motto is "Just Try It!"




2017 Membership Dues

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November Raffle - Jack and Jill/Twins Block

The Fun with Fabric Committee's final raffle block for 2016 will be displayed at the October meeting and the raffle will be held at the November meeting.

The Missouri Star Quilt Company calls the 5" finished block Jack and Jill, but it is frequently referred to as a twin quilt block. Cutting one 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ "white strip and one 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ "pastel strip makes two 5" twin blocks - a positive and a negative.

Instructions for the block are enclosed with this newsletter.


Size: 5" Finished/5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Unfinished

Westerville Quilt Guild November 2016 Raffle Jack and Jill/Twins Block

Size: 5" Finished/5 1/2" Unfinished

Prewashed Fabrics: White Kona cotton <u>and</u> pastel floral, prints, solids, tone-on-tone, batik (Think Spring! – pink, lilac, aqua, blue, yellow, green)

Raffle: Submit as many twin (2) blocks as you want for the <u>November</u> raffle! A set equals one entry.



For one set of "twin" blocks:

Cut an 18" 2 ½" strip of the Kona white and an 18" 2 ½" strip of the pastel. You may
want to cut the strips 19" to give some wiggle room for cutting.

Note: if you do not have intact 18" or 19" strips, you may make four smaller sections.

- Stitch the strips together, press toward the pastel. Use an accurate ¼" seam allowance and a small stitch length.
- Sub-cut the sewn strips into four 4 ½" sections.
- Then slice the 4 ½" sections corner to corner (use same corners) to make triangles (see picture – 3rd row, first illustration).
- Take the four <u>light dominant</u> triangles and form a pinwheel. Do the same with the four <u>dark dominant</u> triangles. Press the first seam to the "long" piece of the triangle.
- Sew those units together for a 5 ½" unfinished block. Pressing the final seam open is recommended.
