# **Snuggled in Hope Quilts**

Our program in January will be presented by Snuggled in Hope Quilts. They provide a quilt for each camper at Flying Horse Farms, located in Mt. Gilead. This is a camp for kids with serious illnesses. Each week is dedicated to a specific type of illness. In this way every camper can participate in every activity offered, as the activities are tailored to specific abilities. No one has to sit out and watch.

I was told they provide 600 quilts a year; so volunteers and materials are necessary to complete the goal. Finished quilts are **55x60**, plus or minus 5 inches in either direction. They accept donations of money, materials, time, completed tops and quilts. All fabric must be 100 percent cotton, no flannel or glittered fabric. They also accept **batting** and **scraps**, **rotary blades**, **rulers** etc.

So, you have a good opportunity to clean out that sewing room clutter; projects you are never going to finish, and fabric you are never going to use. Bring it to the meeting and they will haul it away and "snuggle up", a happy camper!

### Easy Chocolate Mousse Pie

8 Servings

#### **Ingredients**

1 Frozen Regular Pie Crust (10-oz. pkg.)

2 pkg. instant pudding and pie filling mix 2 \(\frac{3}{4}\) cups cold milk

1 cup refrigerated whipped cream or frozen whipped topping, thawed

#### Steps

Prepare pie crust as directed on package for one -crust baked shell using 9-inch pie pan. Cool 15 minutes or until completely cooled.

In large bowl, combine pudding mix and milk; beat 2 minutes with wire whisk. Pour into cooled baked shell. Refrigerate at least 1 hour or until set. Top with whipped topping of choice before serving. Garnish as desired. Store in refrigerator.


