

"Stand Downs are typically one to three day events providing services to homeless Veterans such as food, shelter, clothing, health screenings, VA and Social Security benefits counseling, and referrals to a variety of other necessary services.

Included in these services are housing, employment and substance abuse treatment. Stand Downs are collaborative events, coordinated between local VAs, other government agencies, and community agencies who serve the homeless."

Community Service



We have an opportunity to again help the clients of WARM at Christmas time - but this time, it's their Senior clients! Many times the older folks are left out of Christmas activities because

their families no longer live close, or they no longer can drive or travel, or because they simply don't have many friends living near them anymore. We have a chance to make a difference in these Seniors' lives by making fleece blankets!

Roxanne, WARMs Seniors Life Coach, is thrilled with our idea! She knows that her seniors will be overjoyed with a gift of a blanket - and she is already planning a time where we can be there when the seniors pick up their fleece blankets.

There are no 'rules' on these fleece blankets. If you'd like to make one yourself to donate, purchase fleece that is 1.5 (nice lap quilt) to 2 yards long. You can fringe two sides, or all 4 sides. To keep costs low, a single layer of fleece is plenty. (But if you prefer to use two layers in your blanket, that is fine too!)

If you prefer to simply donate fleece, that is wonderful as well! Purchase fleece at 1.5 - 2 yards long, and bring it with you to the next quilt guild meeting. I will be collecting fleece through the September meeting, to give everyone time to hit those big sales at JoAnn's. I plan to enlist the help of Blendon middle school students to again tie the fleece blankets; it's a great service project for them.
