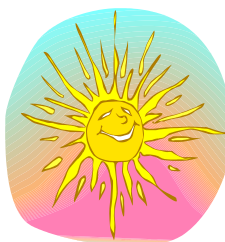

Service Committee News

New for 2019 are our WQG Community Service Days! You can choose either of two dates - Thursday September 26 or Saturday September 28 - to volunteer your sewing skills from 9am - 2pm at St Paul Lutheran Church. Bring your machine, neutral thread, scissors, etc. We will have at least 4 stations setup for you to learn about and sew at least one of the following: Walker Bags (to be donated to WARM), Fidget Quilts (to be donated for use by Alzheimer's and Dementia patients), Pillowcases (to be donated to Children's Hospital) and more! You must sign-up to reserve your spot for one of these days, so that we can have enough materials prepared. Light snacks and water will be provided. We are seeking donations (please bring to the August 27 meeting) of the following items to be used in our Community Service Days:

- red or pink cotton, fleece or flannel, as small as 6" square and larger (for Developmental Hearts)
- fleece for a young child (1.5 - 2 yards) or a teenager (2 - 2.5 yards) (for fleece blankets for MVOB)
- heavy or sturdy fabric such as denim or canvas (male or female prints), as small as 25" by 21" and larger (walker bags)
- occupational or work related fabric, as small as 24" by 24" and larger (fidget quilts)
- male or female related fabric, as small as 6" square and larger (fidget quilts)
- fleece, as small as 24" by 24" (fidget quilts)
- any of the following for fidget quilts: 7" plastic zipper, elastic, Velcro, "bumpy feet" from onesies pajamas, Rick-rack, D ring with webbing, Jeans pocket (cut off from jeans), gross grain ribbon, pieces of fabric with different textures
- cotton material (young kids, teens - for pillowcases) Please bring to the August 27th meeting - thank you!
