

Upcoming Challenges —

CLARA'S CAUSE - Due at July Meeting

2021 is the 140th Anniversary of the founding of the American Red Cross (5/21/1881). In honor of this anniversary, our challenge to you is to make a red and white/cream quilt. The quilt can be any size, shape, etc. Block/pattern selection is up to you. Try a new technique to stretch your skills.



At the Red Cross National Headquarter in Washington, D.C. you will see this charming quilt made by middle school students in 1918 as part of a fundraiser. It includes the signatures of famous people, including Theodore Roosevelt and Helen Keller.

PRECUT PREDICAMENT - Due at November Meeting

Most of us have at least one pack of charm squares lying around. This challenge is to actually use those precuts in a project. Use up your charm packs, layer cakes, jelly rolls, etc. There are tons of patterns on the internet or you can make up your own. (If you don't

have precuts you can make your own out of scraps from larger pieces of fabric.

Pre-Cut Fabric Sizes

- Fat Eigths 9" x 22"
- Fat Quarter 18" x 22"
- Candy 2.5" squares
- Moneybun 1.5" wide strips
- Jellyroll 2.5" wide strips
- Charm 5" squares
- Layer Cake 10" squares
- Turnovers 6" triangles
