#### CITY OF WESTERVILLE DECLARES PUBLIC HEALTH STATE OF EMERGENCY

Mount Carmel St. Ann's, OhioHealth, Central Ohio Primary Care and all Central Ohio health systems are facing critical challenges with the influx of COVID-19 patients, most of whom are unvaccinated. Emergency departments and intensive care units (ICU) are overrun. Health care staff are exhausted. This is a crisis. They need our help, Westerville.

Please: Mask up. Get vaccinated. Cover your cough and sneeze. Stop the spread.

After careful consideration and consultation with leadership at Westerville's hospitals, the City declared a state of emergency on Tuesday, Sept. 21. This emergency declaration will stay in place until November 2, 2021 or until the burden on the local health care system lifts, whichever comes first. On Nov. 2, it will be assessed based on our health care system's ability to provide normal levels of care.

The City Manager is granted the power to declare a state of emergency by the Ohio Constitution, the Charter of the City of Westerville and Chapter 537 of the Codified Ordinances. This is not a mask mandate. It is an appeal to the strength and generosity of the Westerville community to take care of themselves, their families, their neighbors and children.




