

Our second challenge for 2022 is patriotic in nature. We ask you to make a patriotic lap sized Quilt for veterans returning from their trip to Washing-

ton DC with Honor Flight Columbus. Quilts will be collected at the July meeting and donated to the Honor Flight Columbus Crew for distribution to veterans. More details and pattern ideas will be available at the meeting.

#### Quilt requirements:

- Made with patriotic material, but adult masculine material will also work well. (Please, no branch of service specific material. It's too difficult to match up in the welcome home receiving line.)
- Quilted (Fleece tied, knitted, or crocheted, or are also accepted by the Honor Flight crew.)
- Size
  - There is a specific call out for 40" x 40" quilts to be used with wheel chairs.
  - Other preferred sizes are approximately 36" x 45. Bigger sizes will be accepted but quilts should be lap size rather than bed size.
- Labels WQG will be providing labels for the quilts. Please add your name to the sign up sheet at the Fun With Fabric table so we can get an estimate of how many labels we will need. Please put your name down if you think you will participate. Signing up isn't a commitment to complete the quilt on time. We just need to get an estimate of how many labels we need.

#### Optional:

You can attach a note with your name and address so that the veteran receiving your quilt can thank you personally. (Please attach directly to the blanket by safety pin, tying, etc.)

WQG will provide a designated group contact for the guild as a whole. More details and pattern ideas will be available at the meeting.



#### National Pretzel Day - April 26

If you are having trouble deciding which ones, we suggest you mix a bunch of different types of pretzels in a big bowl, and grab a handful, or two, or three, or....

Did you know? Pretzels are believed to be the world's oldest snack. Pretzels date back to 610AD in Southern France. Catholic Monks baked thin strips of dough into the shape of a child's arms folded in prayer. Add a little salt, and Voila! ...the pretzel industry was born.

While pretzels were first baked in France, pretzels have been popular in German bakeries for hundreds of years. In the U.S., the first pretzel was baked in 1850 in Lititz, Pa., by Julius Sturgis.
