# May 24, 2022 Judy O'Shaughnessy, President-of-the-Month Carrie Buck — Trunk Show

A Lecture / Trunk Show presented by Carrie Buck on Fiber and Art: Wool Applique and Design. This will be conducted casually with question and answer time provided. Her website is carriedawaydesigns.net.

Carrie began sewing as a child making clothes for her dolls and as a teenager made much of her own clothing, sometimes embellishing with embroidery or appliqué.

After graduating from Ohio University with a degree in studio arts, concentrating in ceramics, drawing, and fiber, Carrie joined the art fair circuit selling a line of hand painted clothing.

After starting a family and choosing to stay home, she pursued a career in watercolors by taking classes at the Cleveland Institute of Art. After a few years she began selling her work and in 2002 she designed a line of Ohio Bicentennial Barn stationary.

Carrie returned to the world of fiber and art shows in 2006 by selling wool appliqué purses and tote bags made from wool she dyed herself. Soon after she began marketing her designs as patterns for others to create.

Carrie enjoys bicycling, hiking, camping, and gardening, which often serve as sources of inspiration for her designs. Carrie resides in the beautiful city of Columbus, Ohio.

Quilt requirements:

- Made with patriotic material, but adult masculine material will also work well. (Please, no branch of service specific material. It's too difficult to match up in the welcome home receiving line.)
- Quilted (Fleece tied, knitted, or crocheted, or are also accepted by the Honor Flight crew.)
- Size
  - There is a specific call out for 40" x 40" quilts to be used with wheel chairs.
  - Other preferred sizes are approximately 36" x 45. Bigger sizes will be accepted but quilts should be lap size rather than bed size.
- Labels WQG will be providing labels for the quilts. Please add your name to the sign up sheet at the Fun With Fabric table so we can get an estimate of how many labels we will need. Please put your name down if you think you will participate. Signing up isn't a commitment to complete the quilt on time. We just need to get an estimate of how many labels we need.

You can attach a note with your name and address so that the veteran receiving your quilt can thank you personally. (Please attach directly to the blanket by safety pin, tying, etc.)

## Mary Had a Little Lamb

May 24, 1830 - Nursery Rhyme "Mary Had a Little Lamb" was written by Mary Hale of Boston.

The text as originally published consisted of three stanzas, each of eight lines, although the ABAB rhyming scheme allows each stanza to be divided into two four-line parts.

#### MARY'S LAMB

Mary had a little lamb, Its fleece was white as snow, And every where that Mary went The lamb was sure to go ; He followed her to school one day— That was against the rule, It made the children laugh and play, To see a lamb at school.

And so the Teacher turned him out, But still he lingered near, And waited patiently about, Till Mary did appear ; And then he ran to her, and laid His head upon her arm, As if he said—' I'm not afraid— You'll keep me from all harm.'

'What makes the lamb love Mary so ?' The eager children smile—
'O, Mary loves the lamb, you know,' The Teacher did reply ;—
'And you each gentle animal In confidence may bind, And make them follow at your call, If you are always kind.'
