Home of The Brave Update



Calling all volunteers to return finished blocks, quilt tops (place on hanger with measurements attached), and any remaining fabric (place in plastic bag).

At the May meeting, several Home of the Brave quilts will be available for binding. The Service Committee requests that members wanting to start binding at the meeting to bring neutral (light and dark) thread and their favorite hand sewing needles, pins/clips, thimble, and scissors.

Completed returned tops will also be distributed to our volunteer long arm quilters. In May and June, volunteer binders will receive quilts ready for that final step!

Warmth, Romance, Generosity, and
Opportunities Missed/Seized
(Barbara Harwood, Goodtime Quilters, Circleville)

During the Civil War, the Sanitary Commission distributed quilts to soldiers fighting for the Union Army. The Home of the Brave quilts are based on those early patterns.

The quilt makers in the 1860's signed the quilt blocks or wrote an uplifting message on a muslin square. One signature in a donated quilt was that of Fannie Chester of Connecticut. This is a portion of the letter written by the recipient Captain Fisk to Fannie Chester on September 18, 1864.

Miss Fannie Chester:

This is to show that I am the recipient through the U.S. Sanitary Commission of the patchwork bed cover or quilt, which you had a hand in constructing.

I am deeply sensitive of the obligation I am under to you and your fair companions for this your contribution to my comfort....I am proud to testify to the many sterling virtues of New England women: endowed, generally, with rarest gifts of face and form, and education in hand and heart to share the loftiest sphere of the women of New England stand prominent in the estimation of their countrymen as the truest sweethearts, the best wives, and most perfect mothers in the land

I should be much pleased to hear that this note reached you in safety.....

R. Emmett Fisk

Was the quilt and thank you letter (Lincoln Shrine, A.K. Smiley Public Library, Redlands, California) the beginning of a romance for Miss Fannie Chester and Captain R. Emmett Fisk?

Fannie declined to correspond with him because they had not been formally introduced. However, Fannie's sister, Elizabeth, had no such qualms and wrote to Captain Fisk instead of her sister.

Their correspondence and ensuing friendship lead to the marriage of Elizabeth and Emmett in 1867. But what happened to Fannie?

At the May WQG meeting, the Service Committee will be pleased to hear your ideas on Fannie's fate.
