August 25, 2015 Christina Sidebottom & Ruthie Hoover, Presidents-of-the-Month Quilts from the Ohio History Connection

Our speaker will be Becky Odom, Textile History Curator from the Ohio History Connection. She will be bringing 6-10 historic quilts ranging in ages from 1850 to 1965. She will be including a variety of others from 1815 to 1985 in her presentation.



The Ohio History Connection's "collections document both the ordinary and extraordinary stories of Ohioans."

"We collect, preserve, catalog, manage and make available to the public a vast collection of nearly two million objects in our museums across Ohio, and in our flagship mu-

seum in the Ohio History Center. The quilt collection includes more than 500 quilts dating from 1750 to 1991 with the majority of them dating to before 1940. The collection includes quilts that represent almost every style and technique of quilt making: pieced, appliquéd and wholecloth; hand- and machine-stitched; and album, raffle, crazy, red-work, compass, basket, figural and wedding ring patterns. This collection documents everyday living and showcases traditional quilting techniques and styles. The collection is strong in red and green quilts from the early-to mid-1800s. It also has a good selection of crazy quilts from the late 1800s. Approximately 80% of the quilts have a documented connection to Ohio. "



trek to Quilt Odyssey in Hershey, Pa, we crossed paths with a mermaid from Quilter's Fancy in Cortland, Ohio. Our GPS was immediately reprogrammed when we saw the Row by Row featuring the sparkly, embellished sea goddess.

Since Shannon lost focus with all the shiny baubles at a previous stop, we arrived at Quilter's Fancy at closing time. The owner, Cindy Zlotnik Oravecz, greeted us warmly and offered to stay open for our shopping pleasure.

Quilter's Fancy is an embellisher's dream. Cindy specializes in silk ribbon and Victorian needle work and has an amazing selection of ribbon, threads, and beads. The fabric selection is inspiring with a great selection from batiks to wool (and a least a little bit of everything in between). There is a plethora of patterns for embroidery, beading, and quilting.

We loved the variety and scope of this quilt shop. It has a broad selection yet there is depth and uniqueness in the offerings. You can check it out yourself **Thursday Aug 27** – **Sept 5** when Quilter's Fancy joins 11 other shops for the Charming Quilt Shop Tour. This hop features 9 days of shopping, 12 charming quilt shops and prizes, free patterns, free charm squares and more.

Cost of the Passport is \$5 with a portion going toward your neighborhood shop's local charity. With your passport, you will receive a Charming Quilt Shop Tour tote bag that gives you 10% discount at tour participating shops after Sept. 5 until the start of next year's shop tour.
