WQG Featured Quilter -Vickie Mills

Come Early for the Trunk Show (27 Items on Display) Doors Open at 6:00 PM!!

New in 2016, the Westerville Quilt Guild (WQG) will showcase three of our talented members (Vickie Mills, JoAnne Guthrie-Hurst, and Becky Dickson). On March 22, our first featured quilter is Vickie Mills



sharing her traditional, primitive, and civil war quilts and decor.

Vickie describes her quilting style as traditional. Her love of quilting includes pattern design, repro-

duction fabrics, wool and needleturn applique, and longarm quilting. Her "Hoppy Spring" pattern was just published in the current (Spring) issue of Primitive Quilts and Projects.

Since it is "easy, portable, and suits her traditional/primitive style", the quilting trend she is most excited about is wool applique.

Looking for Scraps

I am looking for lots of scraps for a big project! I need scraps with tiny flowers, designs, plaids, stripes, all different colors as well as plain colors that can be used to make scenes with small children's clothing for the 4 seasons. Material that could be used for houses, bicycles, cars, trucks, fences, windows, curtains in the windows, lace, material for animals, etc. Also denim, wool for coats and hats, corduroy too. No bold designs please since the pieces and scenes are going to be very small. Thanks so much for your help.

Although she has pursued other sewing and fiber projects, quilting is Vickie's passion. Her personal quilting motto may be "there is no such thing as too much fabric."

But what was her first quilting or sewing experience? Vickie reports, "My grandma came to live with us when I was about 11 years old. She was my sewing teacher. I made a lot of my clothes in middle/high school and took my first quilting class at The Needleworks in uptown Westerville around 1981. Carol Cleaves (WQG member) was my teacher!!"

Vickie has been a WQG member for around nine years because the guild is "such a friendly, generous, and talented group." She also belongs to a Facebook wool applique group, as well as, a small group of quilters (Patchwork Partners) who go on an Amish Country retreat every fall. Vickie just finished a friendship wall hanging pieced while on a recent retreat. It is a quilt favorite because her quilting friends signed it!

Vickie's trunk show will include 27 of her quilts and decorative items. Come early to see the extensive exhibit and talk to Vickie about her quilting style and passion. Doors open at 6:00 PM!!
