

June Featured Quilter & Trunk Show — 6:00 p,m, JoAnne Guthrie-Hurst Contemporary Eclectic Quilts

JoAnne Guthrie-Hurst has been a Westerville Quilt Guild member since the guild's beginning (2005). In those years, she has designed and constructed numerous modern contemporary quilts and accessories (jackets and tote bags). All used bright fabrics with traditional or modern patterns. At the June 28th guild meeting, twenty-six (26) quilted examples will be on display.

JoAnne describes her first quilting or sewing experience:

"My first sewing experience was with my mother at age 10 or 11, then middle and high school. Through the years I watched my grandmother make quilts but she never taught me. It wasn't until years later when I finally took a quilt class that I was hooked."

Her personal quilting motto is "Make it, finish it, be proud, and show it." JoAnne describes herself as a type "A" personality (she has no UFO's!). She also reports that baking is another creative interest. As guild members, we can enthusiastically endorse Joanne's creativity, talent, and skill in both fabric and food!!

Come early at 6:00 PM to talk to JoAnne and see her extensive contemporary eclectic trunk show. One of the featured items will be her impressive Dear Jane quilt named "Jazzy Janie". Other items include prize winning quilts ("Color Sunburst," "Fantasia," and "Fish Story") and a rag fur jacket "guaranteed to turn heads."


