## Jack Apple Pecan Spice Cake

#### CAKE:

Vegetable oil spray for misting the pan Flour for dusting the pan

- 1 package (18.25 ounces) plain spice cake mix
- 1 cup buttermilk
- ₹ cup vegetable oil
- 2 tablespoons Jack Daniel's Tennessee Whiskey
- 3 large eggs
- 2 cups finely chopped peeled apples (2 med)
- 1 cup chopped pecans

#### GLAZE:

- 4 tablespoons ( $\frac{1}{2}$ stick) butter, melted
- 2 cups confectioners' sugar, sifted
- 3 tablespoons Jack Daniel's Tennessee Whiskey
- 1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract
- 1. Place a rack in the center of the oven and preheat the oven to 350°F. Lightly mist a 13-by 9-inch baking pan with vegetable oil spray, then dust with flour. Shake out the excess flour. Set the pan aside.
- 2. Place the cake mix, buttermilk, oil, whiskey, and eggs in a large mixing bowl. Blend with an electric mixer on low speed for 1 minute. Stop the mixer and scrape down the sides of the bowl with a rubber spatula. Increase the mixer speed to medium and beat for 2 minutes more, scraping down the sides again if needed. The batter should look thick and well blended. Fold in the apples and pecans. Pour the batter into the prepared pan, smoothing it out with the rubber spatula. Place the pan in the oven.
- 3. Bake the cake until it is light brown and springs back when lightly pressed with your finger, 40 to 45 minutes. Remove the pan from the oven and place it on a rack to cool while you prepare the glaze.
- 4. For the glaze, place the melted butter, confectioners' sugar, whiskey, and vanilla in a medium mixing bowl and stir with a wooden spoon until the sugar is dissolved and the glaze is smooth. Spoon the glaze over the warm cake, spreading it out to all sides of the pan. Allow the cake to cool about 30 minutes before cutting it into squares and serving.

Store this cake, covered in aluminum foil, at room temperature for up to 1 week. Or freeze it, wrapped in foil, for up to 6 months. Thaw the cake overnight on the counter before serving.
