From Quilted Trading Cards to Quilted Postcards

Supplies for you to bring:

- ◆ Assorted fabric scraps: 4½" by 6½" is the largest you will need for the postcard, 3" by 4" for the trading card. Travel themes are great for this!
- ◆ Embellishments (relatively flat decorations): Sequins, seed beads, decorative threads, rickrack, lace, ribbon, buttons, and UFO - blocks are some suggestions.
- ◆ Scissors, pins, needle and thread, small ruler, Pencil for drawing shapes on fabric.

Supplies available to you*


- ◆ Glue-we will glue instead of sewing
- ◆ For Postcards: Stiffener for the firmness needed for mailing. Printed backing paper for message and address.
- ◆ For Trading cards: Stiffener and Backing

Suggestion: Spray starch fabrics.

Picnic Recipe

One of the delicious offerings at the 2nd Annual WQG Picnic this July was the following recipe for *Little Smokies*...not the usual sweet and sour sauce with a toothpick either! Thanks to Mari-Jo Scott for the recipe!

$\frac{1}{2}$ Cup butter or oleo
3 tbs honey
3 tbs brown sugar
Heat just until dissolved.


Add $\frac{1}{2}$ cup
chopped nuts.

[I think Mari-Jo used chopped pecans for the picnic.]

Cut crescent rolls into 3 pieces. Wrap around the little smokies. Pour sauce over sausages after placing them in a shallow baking dish.

Bake at 400° for 15—20 minutes.

For the picnic dish (looked like a large $13\frac{1}{2}$ x 9 inch baking dish), Mari-Jo used $1\frac{1}{2}$ cans of crescent rolls and almost a whole package of little smokies.
