### Community Comfort Quilts Gathering Set For Tuesday



The annual gathering of the Community Comfort Quilts will take place at the September meeting with a special showing of the quilts as they are collected.

This will be the second year for the comfort quilt challenge. Two choices of fabrics (in guild colors of green and purple) were passed out to those guild members accepting the challenge to add their own fabrics and create a comfort quilt.

Quilts will once again be offered to the Westerville AWARE project which provides items for residents in need of goods and services because of an emergency situation, a loss of job, or a fire or similar catastrophe. Families identified with the Westerville City Schools reduced lunch program and also assisted with this program.

In addition to that program, quilts donated last year were also given to community residents who had a tragedy that came to our attention through the school system.

Quilts using the challenge fabrics will be gathered on Tuesday, but members may donate any other quilts they wish to the Community Comfort Program. If quilts are not finished, they will gratefully be accepted at a later date.

Thanks to all those who have made quilts in the past and to all those who will be bringing their completed quilts to the Tuesday meeting. Your continued outreach efforts are very much appreciated.


#### Cat Print Fabrics Wanted!
