Tip of the Day: Corralling Your Fusibles

If you have a large assortment of fusible — use mailing tubes in various sizes to keep them organized and easily accessible. Adding a label on the top of each tube allows you to find the correct fusible quickly; standing the tubes up in a cardboard box or plastic tub keeps everything neat and orderly.

More Ways to Store Fusibles

Another way to store fusible or stabilizers and a "green" tip too is to use empty cardboard paper towel or (since it's

the holidays) wrapping paper rolls. Just roll your fusible or stabilizer around the outside of the cardboard and secure with a pin or rubber band or even tie a scrap of fabric around it to hold it in place (another use for scraps or selvedges.) If you have printed instructions, roll them tightly and slip them inside the tube. You can write the name of the fusible on the upper edge of the tube so you can keep them all organized and easy to find again. Store them like the mailing tubes - standing up in a box or tub!
