Penny Haren — Pieced Appliqué



"For more than 20 years, as a quilter and several years as a shop owner, Ohio-based Penny Haren has been developing and teaching techniques that make it quick, easy and fun for quilters —even beginners—to create intricate blocks with stunning results. Her technique, Pieced AppliquéTM, eliminates inset points and curves from even the most complicated blocks. Quilts and blocks that you might never have considered are now not only possible but a breeze." (Haren, 2008)

"She has also designed the new "Square It Up and Fussy Cut" rulers for Creative Grids that help save time and make quilting even easier. They have been so popular that two new sizes of squares are currently in production - a $14\frac{1}{2}$ " and a $16\frac{1}{2}$ " square. These new sizes are great for trimming large appliqués; T-shirt quilts; and home dec projects. Creative Grids is also manufacturing a triangle and rectangle version so you can fussy cut EVERY shape to your heart's content! All of these products will be available by Spring Market at Pittsburgh in May of 2009." (Haren, 2008)

New "Tips" Column

Here's our first tip sent in by Becky Dickson to get us started.

Quilter's Green Tips: Fusible Web Scraps

If you're a fusible web user, save those little scrappy, odd shaped pieces! Instead of pin basting your next small quilt for machine quilting use those small pieces of fusible web to hold the layers together. Take your fusible scraps and peel away the paper. Lay small pieces of web (about $\frac{1}{2}$ inch or so in size) on your batting at intervals similar to what you do with safety pins. Lay the quilt backing on

top and fuse with your iron. Turn it over and place more small pieces of fusible web on the other side of the batting as above. Layer your quilt top over this and fuse. Viola, you're ready to quilt with no pesky pins to bother with.

And you're now officially a "green" guilter!
