Quilter's Green Tips

Here's some ideas for using leftover batting from scraps to somewhat bigger pieces.

From Better Homes and Gardens, American Patchwork and Quilting, April 2009 edition this tip was submitted by Marge Dempster, from Sheboygan, Wisconsin. She suggests you donate leftover batting to a local school. It can be used in art projects to represent snow scenes, bunny tails, and flowers. Like the saying goes, "One Man's trash, is another person's treasure."

If you have some larger pieces but not quite large enough you can sew them together to make a sheet of batting big enough for your project. Overlap the two edges you want to sew together and cut a curvy line. Then butt the two edges together and sew using a zigzag stitch. (A straight line will cause a fold in your quilt.)

Save those 2-4" wide strips from trimming the edges of your quilt after binding. These can be used in a quilt as you go charity quilt project. Cut 2 fabric strips the same width as your batting. Sandwich with wrong sides to batting on either side and cut a piece for the center of the quilt. Using that center make a large (one block) log cabin type of quilt, stitching around the center by placing fabric RST, then batting on one side & fabric strip RST on reverse side. Sew seam. Trim away excess batting, press all pieces away from center. Continue around your log cabin center until you have a charity size quilt.
