
Quilter's Green Tips

Arm's Length Sleeve

When making a small wall hanging, I like to use an old shirt sleeve for the hanging sleeve. It can be trimmed to fit the length needed, and it makes people smile when they see the back of my quilt. - Leah Steiner, Atlanta, GA in American Patchwork & Quilting, October 2003.



Recycle Worn or Warped Cutting Mats

Don't throw away those warped cutting mats or the ones that the lines have all worn off. Use a heavy-duty scissors to cut the old mat into different sizes: small by the iron or sewing machine or for the stabilizer in the bottom of a purse or tote; medium ones for travel or classes.—Becky Dickson, revised from an old tip in *American Patchwork & Quilting*.
